Key Outcomes

- Children developed a clear understanding of their rights and gained confidence to express their views.
- Warli art was used as a tool for cultural advocacy and community awareness.
- The initiative strengthened leadership, teamwork, public speaking, and creative skills among children.
- The murals now serve as permanent visual reminders promoting child rights within the community.



Warli Art for Child Rights demonstrated how art and advocacy can come together to amplify children's voices.
